Trip Summary

Detailed Itinerary

Day 1 Delhi

Saturday, 22 November Arrive in Delhi.

Transfer to hotel.

Briefing and welcome dinner with your guide.

Overnight in Delhi at Lemon Tree Premier Hotel or similar.

Day 2 Delhi - Dimapur - Kohima

Sunday, 23 November Fly to Dimapur.

From here we set off to the capital of Nagaland, Kohima.

With an elevation of 1261m, town of Kohima is located on the top of a high ridge and the town serpentines along the top of the mountain

ranges overlooking Angami Naga tribe settlements. Overnight in Kohima at Hotel Vivor or similar.

Day 3 Kohima

Monday, 24 November On our first full day in North East India, we will begin with a visit the

Kigwema an Angami hilly village.

This village was attacked by the Japanese military, and had stone

memorial constructed at the entrance.

We then move on to Jakhama Village where we walk through paddy fields and the riverbanks, witnessing the Naga way of life and the

Angami fishermen at work.

Finally, we visit Touphema Heritage Village before returning to Kohima

for the night.

Overnight in Kohima at Hotel Vivor or similar.

Day 4 Kohima - Wokha

Tuesday, 25 November Drive to Wokha - inhabited by the Lotha tribe.

We spend the afternoon exploring the nearby villages and spend the

evening at a local guest house.

(In the month of October, renowned migration of Amur Falcons starts

in abundance.)

Overnight in Wokha at Hammock Resort or similar.

Day 5 Wokha - Mokokchung

Wednesday, 26 November We continue our drive north towards Mokokchung.

En-route we stop at Longsa Village, known for its picturesque setting amidst terraced fields and bamboo groves. Explore the village, interact with locals, and learn about Angami Naga culture and traditions. We will also visit the Longsa Village Council Hall, where we can see

traditional Naga architecture and artifacts.

We continue along neighboring villages like Ralan and Englan known



for their skilled artisans and traditional crafts.

Overnight in Mokokchung at Whispering Winds Hotel or similar.

Day 6

Mokokchung - Jorhat

Thursday, 27 November

Today we shall visit the villages of Longkhum and Ungma, all inhabited by the Ao Naga tribe.

Longum was one of the most important settlements of the headhunter era. Built at 1,846m, in a setting of incredible beauty provided by the magnificent rhododendrons on the top of the hills, the village is today known for its industrious inhabitants and their fine handicrafts.

Continue to Jorhat.

Overnight in Jorhat at Kaziranga Golf Resort or similar.

Day 7

Jorhat

Friday, 28 November

Today we take a day trip to Majuli Island, the world's largest river island, located on the Brahmaputra River. Majuli is a cultural treasure trove, home to numerous Vaishnavite monasteries (Sattras) that play a pivotal role in preserving the spiritual and cultural heritage of Assam. Upon arrival on he island, we visit several of these monasteries and about their history and significance in the local community. The local monks often engage in various art forms, including traditional maskmaking and dance, which are integral to the region's cultural identity.

On the island, we will also explore a Mishing tribal village.

Return to the mainland and Jorhat.

Overnight in Jorhat at Kaziranga Golf Resort or similar.

Day 8

Jorhat - Kaziranga National Park

Saturday, 29 November

Morning walk of the Jorhat tean garden, and if open, visit the Tea

Factory.

Later we transfer to Kaziranga National Park - a UNESCO World Heritage site and home of the World famed One Horned Rhino.

Overnight in Kaziranga at Borgos Resort or similar.

Day 9

Kaziranga National Park

Sunday, 30 November

Full day in Kaziranga National Park.

Early start to explore the park on Elephant back. While controversial to some, Elephant ride is the best way navigate through the park to

behold the vigour and charm of the enchanting wildlife.

Later we will visit the Kaziranga Orchid Center, before continuing on a jeep safari to the western range of the park looking for birds and

mammals.

Overnight in Kaziranga at Borgos Resort or similar.

Day 10

Kaziranga National Park - Shillong

Monday, 1 December

After breakfast, head out to explore Shillong, the capital of Meghalaya, often called the "Scotland of the East" due to its rolling hills and scenic



beauty.

Overnight in Shillong at Vivanta Meghalaya Hotel or similar.

Day 11

Shillong - Cherrapunjee

Tuesday, 2 December

After breakfast, we embark on a scenic drive to Cherrapunjee, also

known as Sohra.

Historically recognized as one of the wettest places on Earth,

Cherrapunjee holds the record for the highest annual rainfall, receiving

over 26,000 mm in a year between 1860 and 1861.

En-route we will stop at Umiam Lake.

Overnight in Cherrapunjee at Cherrapunjee Holiday Resort or similar.

Day 12

Cherrapunjee

Wednesday, 3 December

Day trip to Mawlynnong and Dawki, the Bangladesh Border. Nestled in the East Khasi Hills of Meghalaya, Mawlynnong is often

referred to as "God's Own Garden" for its remarkable cleanliness and natural beauty. This small village has earned international recognition for its eco-friendly practices and is a model of community-driven

tourism and environmental sustainability.

Overnight in Cherrapunjee at Cherrapunjee Holiday Resort or similar.

Day 13

Cherrapunjee - Guwahati

Thursday, 4 December

We finally head towards the bustling city of Guwahati.

On the way, we will stop at one of the most revered Hindu pilgrimage sites, the Kamakhya Temple. This ancient temple is dedicated to

Goddess Kamakhya, also known as Sati, one of the various incarnations

of Goddess Durga or Goddess Shakti.

Overnight in Guwahati at Arista Hotel or similar.

Day 14

Guwahati - Delhi

Friday, 5 December

Transfer to Guwahati Airport.

Fly back to Delhi for a final goodbye dinner.

Overnight in Delhi at Lemon Tree Premier Hotel or similar.

Day 15

Delhi - End

Saturday, 6 December

Transfer to airport.

End of trip.

Flights:

Visas:

You will require a Indian visa for this trip. We will provide visa support to help you obtain this. Most nationalities are eligible to apply for an e-Visa.

Food:

This trip is based on Full Board when in the North East of India.

A welcome dinner and farewell dinner is included in Delhi.

Accommodation:

We do not and cannot offer a uniform accommodation standard on our itineraries. We consider comfort, location, design, character, historical interest and whether the money we spend will go into the pockets of the local community when we make our choices of where to stay.

The trip is based on two people sharing. An optional Single Supplement is available upon request.

Transport:
